

## Home learning in the heat ideas

### Maths - capacity and measuring

- 1) fill the sink/bath/paddling pool with water and use different containers such as bottles, jugs, bowls etc. Can you estimate which one can hold the most water? Which one holds the least water? How can you find out?
- 2) Can you practise your number formation?
- 3) Practise your number bonds to 5 - how many ways can you make 5? Can you write the number sentences for these?

### Literacy

We have been reading the story 'Pirates Love Underpants'. If you don't have this book, you can find it on YouTube.

- 1) Can you design your own underpants and write descriptive sentences about them? For example, My pants have pink spots. My pants have green stars.
- 2) Can you draw your own map of where you would hide some treasure and write a sentence of where you would hide it? For example, I would hide my treasure under a tree.
- 3) Can you work with your grown up to tea stain a piece of paper for your map to go on?

## Handwriting

- Can you practice writing the letters in the caterpillar family? a, c, o, d, e, q, g

## Reading

- Find a cool place in your home to read a book - where is the coolest place?
- Read your home reading book and write it in your reading diary. Have you read the ones on Oxford Owl?

## Other ideas:

- Make a nice cool smoothie or fruit salad and write instructions for it
- Freeze things and play with the ice - how quick will it melt?
- Play a board game with a parent or sibling
- Count how many stairs you have at home or practice counting out 30 items.
- Have a tea party with your teddys at home - can you make a menu?
- Use paper and pens to design your own pirate hat
- Have a look in your recycling - can you make a pirate ship? Can it float or will it sink?
- Put different things in the water - what floats and what sinks? What can you add to something to make it sink?
- Make a sun safety poster - what can you do to keep safe in the sun?
