

Geography Curriculum Mapping – Glenfield Infant School

Year 1	Autumn 1 — Our School	Spring 1 — Our local area and our country	Summer 2 — Wonderful Weather
	Outline of unit: Year 1 will build on their knowledge from Year R where they looked at the school and the woods within our school grounds. Year 1 will expand on our school and look at the area surrounding our school. Children will know the area we live in — Bitterne. They will know Bitterne is in Southampton and Southampton is in England. The children will also learning about Human and Physical characteristics in their local area. Using this knowledge they will make their own map of their own city with reasons why they have chosen certain human and physical characteristics.	Outline of unit: Building on previous learning in Autumn 1 the children will learn about the 4 countries in the UK. They will also learn the 4 capital cities of these 4 countries. The children will compare the human and physical characteristics of London to the human and physical characteristics of Bitterne.	Outline of unit: Year 1 will build on the children's knowledge of weather from Year R. They will begin to monitor the weather, describe the 4 seasons, using geographical knowledge for weather, and learn how to measure weather.
	By the end of the unit the children will know/be able to: *describe the human characteristics of our local area *describe the physical characteristics of our local area *Know what our local area is called — Bitterne *Know that our area (Bitterne) is in Southampton. *Know that Southampton is in England.	By the end of the unit the children will know/be able to: *name the 4 countries in the UK *name the 4 capital cities of the UK countries *Compare the human and physical characteristics of Bitterne and London.	By the end of the unit the children will know/be able to: *name the 4 seasons *describe an average weather pattern for each season *identify weather symbols: sunny, clouds, snow, rain, wind, lightening, weather warning, *use weather symbols to represent daily weather *know how to measure rainfall (rain gauge), wind direction (weather vane), wind speed (anemometer and beaufort scale), temperature (thermometer), and name the equipment they will use
