### What should I already know?


I have used a variety of drawing media and paint to make marks and create my own pictures.

### Vocabulary

artist	A person who creates pictures, paintings and sculptures.
control	The way a drawing material is held.
line	A mark that can be long, short, thin or thick, and can help make shapes.
pressure	The force used on a material when drawing.
shape	The outline of an object
connect	To join something together.
organic	An irregular shape without a name, often found in nature.
portrait	A painting or drawing or photo of the head and shoulders.


1. Can I use control and pressure to create different types of lines?

**Sticky Knowledge** Different types of lines can be created including straight, wavy, curved, dashed, dotted and zigzag.

2. Can I draw different lines in response to music?



**Sticky Knowledge** Pressure, control and drawing materials can be changed in response to music.

3. What happens if I connect lines?



Organic shapes are not regular and don't have a name.



Different types of lines can be used to complete and create shapes.

**Sticky Knowledge** Lines can be connected to create shapes. These shapes may be organic.

4. How can shapes help to make drawings?

Shapes can be found all around us in different objects., even faces

**Sticky Knowledge** Basic shapes can be used to draw a portrait. A portrait is a picture of a person's head and shoulders.
