Vocabulary

celebration	A special event where people gather to have fun and show happiness about something important
Harvest	When farmers collect up the crops they have grown like fruits and vegetables because they are ripe and ready to eat
Church	The special place where Christians meet
Christian	The name given to people who follow Jesus

Step 1—Communicate

I can express creatively my own responses to a celebration



People celebrate different things including birthdays, new babies, religious festivals, weddings, new jobs

Step 4—Contextualise

I can recognise some ways in which Christians *celebrate* Harvest



Christians may celebrate Harvest by giving food to the poor, having a Harvest supper, singing special songs or decorating the church

Step 2 - Apply

I can recognise how *celebration* relates to my own and others' lives



I know that people celebrate different occasions in different ways and that it's ok to not want to celebrate

Step 5—Evaluate

I can talk about the importance for Christians of *celebrating* Harvest



Christians feel it is important to celebrate Harvest to show that they are thankful to God for all the good things they have.

Step 3—Inquire

I can recognise what a *celebration* is and list some features of celebrations



Celebrations might involve: food, dancing, singing, gift giving and decorations
