

Help each other with their work


Good friends show special qualities,

happy	Feeling pleased or glad
safe	Feeling secure and out of danger or harm
caring	Showing kindness and concern for others
feelings	Emotions that we experience
help	Assist someone to achieve
friendly	Showing kindness to others
bullying	The repeated and intentional harm of a person
repeated	Done again and again

2. How are you feeling today?

We learned about **different feelings** and how to name them. We learned how to **respond positively** to different emotions.



We all show feelings in different ways. This is okay. We can respond with understanding.

3. How can we help everyone to be happy?

Some things can make us feel **unhappy** and other things make us feel **happy**. These are both **normal feelings**.

5. Do you know when a behaviour is bullying?
