## What should I already know?


- That Jews + Christians use candlelight at festivals to remember

## Vocabulary

Hindu	Hindus believe that life is a cycle of birth, death, and rebirth. They also believe that the next life depends on how the previous life was lived.
Vishnu	Vishnu is the <b>preserver</b> of the world. His role is to return to the earth in troubled times and restore the balance of good and evil. He has blue skin and four arms.
Holi	Hindu festival that celebrates spring, love, and new life.
Krishna	One of the most revered deities in Hinduism
Holika	The king's sister
Prahlad	a revered figure in Hindu mythology, known as a saintly prince and a devoted follower of Lord Vishnu.


## Step 1—Inquire
