Generosity: Dana in Hinduism

### Vocabulary

<b>Generous</b>	Being kind and happy to share, give, or help others without expecting anything back.
<b>Community</b>	A group of people living in the same area or sharing common interests, goals, and values.
<b>Dana</b>	The practice of giving or generosity in many Eastern cultures and religions.
<b>Hindu</b>	A Hindu is someone who follows Hinduism, one of the world's oldest religions and a way of life that began in India.

### Step 1—Communicate

I can express creatively my response to my own experiences of *community*



**A community is a group of people who live in the same area or share common interests, goals or values.**

### Step 2 - Apply

I can recognise my responses in relation to giving to my *community*.



**I can give an example of an activity that shows generosity in the community (Harvest festival, litter picking etc).**

### Step 3— Inquire

I can recognise what has been taught about *community* and identify examples of community



**I can talk about local examples of generosity in the community: Southampton City Mission, Frankie Benali, Sophie's Legacy**

### Step 4—Contextualise

I can recognise how *community* is represented within the Hindu tradition of *dāna*.



**Dana, meaning generosity, is one of the most important values in Hindu communities.**

### Step 5—Evaluate

I can recognise the value of *community* to people who celebrate Hindu Traditions and to themselves.



**I can participate in an act of generosity in my community and talk about it.**
