What should I already know?


I have observed weather conditions daily during Year R and considered what clothing would be appropriate when dressing to go outside to play.

Vocabulary

seasons	One of the four parts of the year where changes are seen.
weather	The conditions outside at a particular place and time.
wind	Air as it moves naturally over the surface of the Earth.
change	To become different.
observation	The act of taking in the environment through one of our senses.
data	Information that can be used to learn about something.
United Kingdom	A nation made up of England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland.

1. What different types of weather are there?



We can observe lots of different types of weather and watch them continuously change.

2. How can we record the weather?



The weather can be recorded in a weather report. We can use pictures, words and symbols to record the weather conditions observed.

3. What causes the weather to change?



Wind direction can affect our weather. Wind from the north tends to be quite cold, while wind from the south is warmer.

4. When do the four seasons occur in the United Kingdom?




The four seasons are: spring, summer, autumn and winter. Each season brings different weather conditions. In the UK, the year begins and ends in the season of winter.

5. What is the weather like in different parts of the United Kingdom throughout the year?



The weather in the United Kingdom can differ depending on the wind direction. The north is often colder than the south.
