Maths

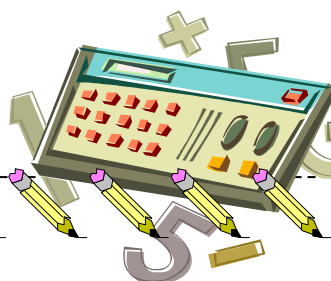
In our Maths work, we will continue to focus on problem solving and reasoning skills. This half term we will be looking at decimal fraction and short multiplication and division.

We will continue to learn our times tables on a regular basis. The children are beginning to get much more confident and regular practice at home will really embed this skill.

English

This term Year 4 will continue focusing on the book 'The Trojan Horse' by Emily Little creating our own narrative. We will continue to look at various aspects of SPAG during our English sessions we will continue to focus on inverted commas, using a greater variety of conjunctions and main and subordinate clauses. During our reading 'Text Interrogation' sessions we will be focusing on our comprehensive approach.

Spelling continues to be a big focus in Year 4. We will continue to have weekly spelling tests and encourage the children to use taught spellings in their writing. Please continue to support with this at home. Reading and library books will continue to be checked once a week. Please remind your child to bring their book in when they are ready to change it.





Journey

- In History, we will be exploring, 'The Greeks' with a particular focus on the life and experiences of a Greek soldier. Our Science investigations will include 'States of Matter', with particular reference to explaining the relationship between Solids, Liquids and Gases.

Homework

The homework system will stay the same as last half term, with the children receiving weekly spellings (evidence in homework books), reading at home x4 and Times Tables.
