Year 3 Newsletter

Maths

In Maths we will continue to think about numbers to 1000 including:

- The relative size of two three-digit numbers can be determined by examining the hundreds digits, then the tens digits and then the ones digits, as necessary.
- Three-digit multiples of ten can be expressed multiplicatively and additively, in terms of tens and hundreds.
- Known facts and strategies for addition and subtraction within and across ten, and within 100, can be used to support calculation within 1000.
- Familiar counting sequences can be extended up to 1000.
- We will also look at the 2, 4 and 8 times tables.





<u>English</u>

Our key text in English is 'Our Tower', by the children's Laureate Joseph Coelho. The children will explore the story structure, characters, events, and plot before planning and writing their own adventure narrative. There will be a focus on capital letters for proper nouns, complex sentences, and conjunctions. The children will also be encouraged to use higher-level vocabulary.

In reading, we will explore the text 'What's it like to be a bird'. The children will continue to develop their inference and retrieval skills. They will predict and ask questions to improve their understanding of the text. They will also draw out the main ideas from a key paragraph.

<u>Theme</u>

This term our Geography topic focuses on cities.

We will be exploring the difference between

villages, towns, and cities. Finding out where

the major cities in the UK are located and

investigating the human features of a city. We

will be looking closely at the cities of Manchester

and Liverpool as they are the closest cities to our

location.



<u>Science</u> Our science topic for this half term is Rocks and Soils. We will be: Defining the term 'rock'. Describing the appearance of different rocks; identifying both crystals and Grouping rocks by their absorbency, hardness and reaction to acid rain (vinegar) Describing fossil formation and identify fossils in rocks. Naming, describing and comparing some different categories of soil. Listing some of the benefits of earthworms to the soil. Using a magnifying glass correctly to observe the appearance of a rock in detail. Using results to choose the appropriate rock type for a specific use, suggest a better choice of rock for a specific use and to predict how a rock will be affected by the weather. Homework will be set on Class Dojo and can be completed by 2 All submitting it on Class Dojo, children may also complete it in their homework book and send a picture.
