Maths



This half term we will be looking at decimals, fractions and percentages, using and calculating scale factor as well as, reading and interpreting line graphs and pie charts. In addition to this we will also be looking at converting measures. We will also continue with lots of arithmetic practise.

English- Writing

This half-term our focuses will be varying sentence openers, high quality punctuation (such as colons & semi-colons) and using adverbial and prepositional phrases. We will also be exploring play scripts as we prepare our leavers production and will write our own short extract of a script.

Reading:

Reading at home is extremely appreciated and will help the children experience a wide range of vocabulary. Reading with the children at home and/or discussing books and texts helps them to continually develop their knowledge and understanding. Children will undertake at least three in-class reading sessions per week and have time in class to read for pleasure. Please encourage your child to update their own reading comments at home or feel free to add comments if you have read with your child.



Theme: In our theme work we will be focusing on history, where we will be exploring the Vikings. We will be asking, why was Alfred the Great so significant? As well as examining the Viking and Anglo- Saxon struggle for the kingdom of Britain.

In Science, we will be continuing to look at the circulatory system learning about the heart and the different components that make up our blood.

In our computing sessions we will be looking at coding using Micro:bits.

Homework

Spellings

Spellings will be given out each Friday. To practise spellings your child can write out the word, cover and practise writing down the correct spelling. In class, your child will look at the spelling pattern and spelling rule. It may help to underline the rule or pattern in each word when practising. Spelling practise can be short bursts throughout the week and can be completed in a written form or orally.

To fully understand the meaning of the word, please encourage your child to look up the meaning of the spelling words each week.
