Congratulations to all involved - we are proud of you! Thank you Mr Ireland for your continued leadership and support in organising these exciting events!






Thank You for our Harvest!

Applying for and Starting School 2026 –Some important dates!

For children starting Primary and Secondary school in 2026, applications are now open!

For Secondary Schools online applications must be submitted by 31st October (please note this date is during the half term break).

For children starting Primary School, the online application closes by midnight on 15th January 2026.

Please make sure you have applied in time!





Our One-way system into school for EYFS and KS1

Our school has a one-way system to ease congestion in and out of school and support the safety of our children during drop-off and pick-up times. Please can **Key stage 1 parents enter school via the Mulberry Lane gate and then exit via the office gate**. Staff will be available to guide parents in the right direction, especially for newcomers to the school.

For safety reasons we expect <u>all children</u> to dismount from scooters and bikes prior to entering the school site and use the dedicated shelters for storage, not the fence area.





Please can families encourage all toddlers and younger siblings to climb off scooters and pushbikes on their way into/ out of school.

We don't want any collisions, thank you!

Communication

Please can we ensure that all emails, including those for Class teachers are directed to office@goringprimary.org.

Our office/ admin staff are very efficient at ensuring messages are swiftly received by teachers. Teachers will aim to respond as soon as is possible, although this may not always be on the same day due to their teaching commitments.

To save on emails- if may be quicker to speak to the teachers at the end of the day after pick-up times.

Medical

If your child has a health care plan and your child's plan has not yet been returned please complete and return forms asap.

All medication required by your child in school must be sent to the office in its original labelled packaging.
Remember to make a note of expiry dates beforehand so that you can provide replacements as necessary.
This remains your responsibility.



A gentle reminder please not to send your child into school with any nut-based products into school. We have children whose allergies include contact as well as the consumption of nuts. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

School Absence

If your child is absent for any reason, please notify the school office before the school day:

Headteachers are NOT allowed by law to authorise absence in term time except for 'exceptional circumstances'.

Children are expected in school for 190 days per year. Holidays in term time cannot be authorised unless in 'exceptional circumstances'.

In the exceptional case where you may have to request absence from school, please collect a form from the school office.

This should be at least a month in advance of the date of the first absence.





Sickness

If your child has sickness or diarrhoea they must not come in to school until 48 hours after the last bout of sickness.

We are grateful for any time parents/carers and other family members can give to come and support/volunteer in school with reading, art activities, sewing, cooking etc.

If you are interested in volunteering on a regular basis, all volunteers must have an up to date DBS check and must sign in/out at the start/end of their session.

You will also receive a leaflet about keeping our children safe. Please come to express your interest at the School Office.

Please do provide a raincoat for your child to school each day, just in case.


