"I wanted to update you on the work the Governors are undertaking as part of our recruitment of a new head teacher at Goring. As a board, we have met with the Diocese and Local Authority in order to agree on a timetable and appoint the sub-team that will make the appointment.

We have carried out some work around the qualities we think are particularly important for any new Headteacher at Goring. The Governors are clear of what these attributes are and any new appointment will be charged with continuing the Christian ethos, vision and values which underpins the core strengths of the school.

Our current plan is to appoint for the Autumn term in 2025, with Mr Ireland remaining in post until then, and we are working towards that date. I wish you all a very happy and restful Christmas.

### **Admissions Policy Consultation**

It was decided we would use this as an opportunity to support the charity Christian Aid because of the war and violence that continues to affect millions of people around the world, including in Palestine and Ukraine

As a school, we have raised £311.75, and we hope that our contribution joins with many other communities to support lasting peace for all.

### **Christmas Fayre**

On behalf of our school community, I would like to express my gratitude to our PSA this term for all they have helped to organize and provide for us. Their efforts culminated in this year's Christmas Fayre, which was a hugely successful event led by Emma Page, Jenn Hutchinson, Lisa Woodley and supported by the whole PSA committee, parent volunteers, and local businesses too. ### **Reminders – Hairstyles**

We are seeing an increasing number of children coming into school with hair that does not align with our uniform expectations. As per our school expectations, we require all students to avoid extreme hairstyles. These include:

- Hair which is longer than shoulder length to be tied back
- No extreme hair styles, these include unnatural colour, shaved lines or patterns, distinct changes in length in the hair (changes should be graduated)
- No hair-wraps/ holiday-style hair

We kindly ask that you ensure your child's hairstyle complies with these. Upholding the expectations of the school is crucial for upholding a consistent and respectful environment for all students in our primary school.
