Earlier in the summer term, our Year 6 pupils took part in an unforgettable residential visit to Cobnor. This was a fantastic opportunity for the children to develop their teamwork, learn new skills, and—most importantly—demonstrate the school values that are at the heart of everything we do at Goring During their stay, the children took part in a range of exciting activities, including kayaking, paddling, archery, and more. One of the main focuses of the trip was enabling our pupils to work towards their RYA Level 1 certification—a brilliant achievement that highlights their determination and hard work.

Throughout the week, we saw the children encouraging each other, tackling challenges together, and showing real resilience when things got tough. A huge thank you goes to Miss Jones, Mrs Howlett, Mrs Vachhani, Miss Weare, Mrs Macara and Mrs Durr for giving up their time to support and enable the children to have this valuable experience.





Two weeks ago, the Year 6 children took part in the Fiver Challenge, an enterprise initiative designed to develop creativity, teamwork and business skills. We were incredibly proud of the imaginative ideas and careful thought they put into their games and products. This year's cohort raised more money than any previous Year 6 group—a remarkable achievement! The funds rasied by the children will

support our school's ongoing charitable donations, contribute to their Leavers' Party, and help purchase legacy items for future pupils at Goring C of E Primary. Over the coming weeks, children will be brainstorming ideas for what these special legacy items might be. Amidst a busy schedule of enrichment activities, our Year 6 pupils also joined with other Church of England schools from across West Sussex for this year's Diocesan Leavers' Service at Chichester Cathedral. Over 400 children and their families came together in a spirit of prayer, song, and worship to celebrate the end of their primary school journey. We were honoured to be invited to lead the prayers looking forward to the future, with Bobby and Saffy reading their prayers clearly and thoughtfully. It was a wonderful opportunity for our Year 6 children to reflect on their time at Goring and to appreciate the friendships and experiences they have shared.

Although the last few weeks have been filled with activity, there is still more to look forward to, with the production of Peter Pan and our own Leavers' Service coming up soon.

### Year 2 - Arundel Wetlands & Legacy Games

This special letter box allows children and adults to post letters, drawings, or cards to those they miss—whether it's for a birthday, anniversary, or simply to share a memory. The post box is located on the left side of the Marine Gardens restaurant, in a quiet, secluded spot. It is available 24/7, with wheelchair access and free parking to ensure everyone can visit. All messages remain private, as letters are never opened—instead, they are respectfully shredded and turned into compost for the gardens.





#### West Sussex Music – Summer Holiday Activities

West Sussex Music are keen to encourage as many children as possible to have the opportunity to develop and explore their musical talents over the summer holiday. They have planned for a range of workshops, for children between the ages of 8-16, to take place. The sessions range from cinema soundtracks to beat-making DJ sessions. ### Online Safety – Spotlight on TikTok

Children now have more access to technology than ever, and apps like TikTok are especially popular among young people. At Goring, we have noticed some pupils discussing TikTok and sharing their knowledge of it.

While TikTok offers creative opportunities, it also comes with risks—such as exposure to inappropriate content or unwanted contact. It's important for parents and carers to stay informed about what children are accessing and the age restrictions of particular apps (TikTok should not be used by children under the age of 13).



West Sussex has produced a helpful guide for families. It covers setting privacy controls, monitoring screen time, and recognising when your child might need extra support.

We encourage all parents and carers to talk regularly with children about their online experiences. Staying involved is the best way to support your child's safety and wellbeing online.
