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Contextual details

Gorse Hill Primary School and Nursery is a two-form intake primary school. The capacity of each year group from Reception to Year 6 is 60 pupils. The school also has a Nursery which caters for 3-year olds, the capacity of which is 100. The theoretical capacity of Gorse Hill School is therefore 520 pupils.

Currently, there are approximately 50 staff members employed to work in the school. The school employs 18 teaching staff, including senior leaders, 16 of whom are full-time.

Opening times:

The school's opening times are 8:30am-3:30pm Monday to Thursday and 8:30am-1pm on a Friday.

The Nursery closes at 3:30pm Monday to Friday.

The school also offers extra-curricular provision until 4:15pm on Monday to Thursday.
