Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the first edition of our newsletter for the 2022-2023 academic year.

I would like to take this opportunity by sharing just how proud I am of our children and how they have returned to school following the summer holidays. It has been fantastic to observe positive attitudes to learning in lessons and our CARE Values being embodied by the children, particularly during social times.

I am also delighted to share with you that our school has been awarded the Music Mark Award in recognition of our commitment to music as part of the broad curriculum that we offer. This year, children in Year 2, 3 and 4 will all have the opportunity to learn a musical instrument as part of the music curriculum we offer, in partnership with the Swindon Music Service. Year 2 pupils will learn to play the African drums, Year 3 the Ukulele and Year 4 the guitar.

At the start of term, we have held a number of assemblies, including our first House team assembly -I think it is fair to say that there is already a healthy sense of competition developing between the House teams! Last week, we welcomed Bart Gee to our school. Bart, who lives with the physical disability arthrogryposis, delivered an assembly to our pupils relating to our value of showing courage when faced with a challenge. Bart shared his story of how, when faced with a difficulty, he has embraced the challenge and overcome this, competing in triathlons, learning to play a musical instrument and learning to drive – a truly inspirational story for our pupils reinforcing the idea that 'difficult', 'hard, 'challenging' definitely does not mean 'impossible'!

Good attendance at school is vital in ensuring that all children maximise their full potential and make the academic, social and personal progress that they are capable of. Every time that a child is absent from school or late in arriving, it means that they miss an important part of their learning journey.

Every school day counts for every pupil so as a school, we aim for our pupils to be in school, on time, every day. We do, however, recognise that there may be a small number of occasions when this is not possible (e.g. if a child is unwell) and for this reason 96% and above is deemed acceptable levels of attendance. This is in line with Government expectations.

You can support us to promote good attendance levels of your child by ensuring that they come to school each day and that. wherever possible, appointments are made outside of school time. *Requests for holiday during term time will not be authorised.*

A reminder that school has a tuck shop available (KS2 only) during breaktime, where your child can purchase a small snack, such as baked crisps, yoghurt covered fruit pieces, skinny popcorn, pretzels, cheese nibbles, dairylea dunkers, raisins and more. Most products costing between 20 - 30p each.

Drinks are also available, along with frozen yoghurt and ice pops during the warmer months.

If your child would like to buy from the tuck shop, 50/60p will normally cover a snack and a drink each day.
