

Where in the World?

Computing

Children will be taught to:

- Learn how to keep safe when searching information online.
- Count and compare different objects.
- Answer questions about groups of objects.

PSHE

Children will be taught about:

- How their bodies have change since being a baby.
- Coping with changes in life.

Maths

Children will be taught to:

- Double and halve numbers to at least 20.
- Understand multiplication as arrays and finding equal groups.
- Understand division as grouping and sharing.
- Recognise value of money—different coins and notes
- Develop understanding of mass—heavier, lighter, use non-standard and standard units.

Music

Children will be taught to:

- Develop knowledge of rhymes and beat through drumming in time to well-known songs.
- Find the pulse in music.
- Perform to an audience.

English

Children will learn how to:

- Write sentences for a purpose using phonics to support spelling.
- Use 'and' to join words and clauses.
- Write a series of linked sentences to write a story and a non-chronological report about animals.
- Apply phase 5 phonics to decode for reading and segment for spelling.

ART and DT

Children will be taught to:

- Work in 3D, inspired by birds.
- Create art collaboratively inspired by flora and fauna.

Science

Children will be taught to:

- Identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants including deciduous and evergreen trees.
- Identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees.
- Observe closely using magnifying glasses and comparing and contrasting familiar plants.

PE

Children will be taught:

• Develop athletics skills of throwing and running.

RE

Children will be taught:

 Understand the importance of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur for Jewish children.

Geography

Children will be taught:

- To explain the main things that are in hot and cold places
- Locate Swindon, the UK and India on a world map.
- Compare the similarities and differences of an area in India with Swindon, looking at climate and landscape.
