A Box Full of Memories

Computing

Children will be taught to:

- Recognise different forms of technology in and around the classroom.
- Recognise and name the parts of a computer.
- Learn how to keep safe when using the internet

PSHE

Children will be taught about: Celebrating Differences, including their responsibilities and rights as members of different types of communities and families. They will learn to understand that actions have consequences and to feel special and safe in school.

<u>Maths</u>

Children will be taught to:

- Understand numbers and place value up to 20.
- Calculate one more/one less than numbers up to 20.
- Recognise standard and non-standard patterns up to 20 quickly.
- Know number facts up to 10.
- Know the properties of shape

Music

Children will be taught to:

- Create and respond to vocal and body percussion sounds.
- Maintain a steady beat and control/ change tempo
- Explore descriptive sounds and sequence sounds.

English

Children will learn how to:

- Write words and captions for a purpose using phonics to support spelling and capital letters and full stops within their writing.
- Apply phonics to decode for reading and segment for spelling.
- Write a series of linked sentences to write a character description based on the book 'Lost in the Toy Museum

ART and DT

Children will be taught to:

- Use different mediums, like paint or graphite to create their own spiral art.
- Look at the work of famous artists and discuss what they notice and how it makes them feel.
- Experiment confidently with mark making, focusing on snail art.
- Reflect and discuss their own art and the work of others.

Science

Children will be taught to:

- Distinguish between a material & objects.
- Identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, metal, rocks, water.
- Describe the simple physical properties of everyday materials - link to uses in world.
- Compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their simple physical properties.

PΕ

Children will be taught:

- The basic skills and movements of Muay Thai which is a form of Martial Arts
- Golden-mile

History and Geography

Children will be taught:

- About toys from the past through to today.
- To distinguish between and say why toys are new or old.
- To discuss and compare the materials toys are made from.
- To sort toys into groups according their different properties, linking with our Science.
