What phonics looks like at Grange Junior School...

Revisit and Review - Children revisit all the GPCs, some words with previous GPCs and tricky words taught so far.



Teach - Children will be taught the new GPC and matching grapheme for that lesson, including formation of the grapheme. They will also be introduced to a new tricky word.



Practise - Children use the new GPC to apply it in different ways such as oral blending, reading and writing.



Apply - This will be consolidation of the lesson using the GPC taught through either reading or writing. This will also include the



Implementation:

How do we do it at Grange Juniors?

We follow the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Rapid Catch-Up programme. When required, children complete an initial assessment. This identifies the gaps in phonemes for each child and allows them to begin the programme at the appropriate starting point.

The Little Wandle Rapid Catch-Up programme is taught as daily lessons and is regularly assessed to check where the learning gaps are. Each week includes two discrete phonics sessions, a review session, a decoding session, a prosody session and a comprehension session.

At Grange Junior School, we ensure that each child feels successful in their learning so every reading book that is given to a child on the Little Wandle Rapid Catch-Up programme will be phonically decodable, containing only the graphemes and tricky words that they are familiar with.

We ensure that children who need additional support with reading are heard on a 1:1 basis regularly by class teachers and learning support assistants. This ensures they have regular opportunities to apply their phonics skills.

On leaving Grange Junior School children will...

At Grange Junior School, we aim to ensure that children master the necessary phonemes, graphemes, tricky words, prosody skills and comprehension skills to achieve the age-related benchmarks at appropriately mapped out time points. The children will develop a love for reading and this will in turn promote their English skills and influence their writing later on in life.
