

# **Grange Junior School** Round Up Term 1 – Issue 2 – 2023 Termly Value - RESPECT

### Year 3

In year 3 we have been writing about the book 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley'. We have been writing compound sentences using coordinating conjunctions and, but, so and or. In guided reading we have been comparing the books 'Someone Swallowed Stanley' and 'Flotsam' looking at their similarities and differences. In maths we have been learning about 100s, 10s and 1s and their place value. We have recognised and represented 3-digit numbers on a number line and have written 3-digit numbers in words. In art we have been practicing mark making and shading. We discovered that 'a line is a dot that has been taken for a walk'. In our multi-sports PE lesson we practiced the skills agility, co-ordination and balance.

#### Year 6

We have had a super week in Year 6 this week. The children have worked really hard in our new unit of writing based on 'The Viking Boy by Tony Bradman.' We have been exploring vocabulary choices to create a dramatic setting that creates atmosphere. We explored the different writing techniques we could use, e.g. similes, personification and metaphors. The children have really impressed us with their descriptions. In art, we have begun our unit of work on Self-Portraits. The children have built upon their prior learning and will be using an artist as a stimulus throughout our sequence of lessons. We have thoroughly enjoyed Dodgeball this week and the children are developing great team work skills and modelling our value of the term – 'Respect.'

### Year 4

We have had a busy, first full week including tests! Well done Y4s for completing them. In Maths, we have been looking at number lines and have been learning to plot 4 digit numbers on scales going up in 1000s, 100s and 10s. In reading and writing we have used drama and freeze framing to tell the story of different fairy tales and to imagine a character's emotions and thinking. Our text is Wolves in the Walls which we are writing about using compound sentences and conjunctions. In Computers we are learning about the internet and how we can search safely. In Art we have started our look at drawing and experimenting with shading and other techniques. We look forward to seeing your artistic talents develop Y4.

### Year 5

We have had a very busy first full week back! In writing, we have been looking at expanded noun phrases with prepositional phrases and very much enjoyed using this skill to create a Holiday Let advert as well as a character description of Jub (based on The Lost Happy Endings picture book). In Maths, we have started exploring 6-digit numbers. We also enjoyed practising our Year Group Song, the Circle of Life from The Lion King. In addition to Music, Laurel class had their first clarinet lesson, led by Mr Yorke from Swindon Music Services. In Science, we created a story board to show our understanding of the process of pollination. We were very excited to start our first Art Unit and explored different hardness of sketching pencils to make marks. We finished the week with a short Year Group Assembly.
