

### Year 3

This week, Year 3 have been deepening their understanding of forces and magnets. We have looked at a variety of coins and then investigated which are magnetic.

In Writing, we have started looking at our new book 'Stella and the Seagull'. We have used this text as inspiration for writing sentences in the past progressive tense!

In History, we have looked at primary and secondary sources. We then compared the Stone Age to the Iron Age and completed a Venn diagram showing similarities and differences between these time periods.

### Year 4

In Maths, we have been learning to round 3 and 4-digit numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000, whilst chanting our x3 times table. Keep using your TTRS to practice!

In reading and writing we have been looking at the features of a diary, as well as celebrating Black History Month with some poetry reading.

In Science we have been testing chocolate melting points at different temperatures and hopefully remembering our understanding of particles!

In PE we have continued our Gymnastics with our school coach, as well as learning skills and tactics of Dodgeball. We look forward to seeing your sporting talents develop this year Y4.

### Year 6

This week, we have celebrated National Poetry Day through Black History Month. We have explored a poem called 'No Stuff by Eloise Goldsmith' - a poem inspired by the life of Harriet Tubman. Year 6 have really impressed us with the knowledge they have retained about how Harriet Tubman led hundreds of enslaved people to freedom before the American Civil War in 1861. The children have gone on to write exceptional poems which capture the power of freedom from slavery. We culminated the day by hosting our own poetry slam in school. Well done to those children who took part! In Computing, we explored how we can work collaboratively make а joint PowerPoint presentation. The children were astonished at how fantastic this tool is and could see the benefits to them as they get older.

### Year 5

This week in year 5 we have been polishing our skills in writing in the past tense and produced an eye-witness account and missing persons poster for the disappearance of our main character, Rhodopis. For National Poetry Day we have produced outstanding poems based on our Black History Month figure, Harriet Tubman whose life we have studied this week. We have discussed the harshness of slavery and the importance of freedom both then and now. We are very proud our of year 5s.

We have been perfecting our singing skills on The Circle of Life by *The Lion King* in music this week and look forward to performing it to the school soon.


