

Year 3

This week in science, we have been looking at how our bodies move using our skeleton and muscles. We have looked at joints, particularly the elbow joint. We now know that muscles can only pull, they cannot push. Using a model of the arm, we looked at how the biceps and triceps work together by contracting and relaxing, making the arm move!

In maths, we have been using what we know to help us add. For example, if we know that 2 + 4 = 6 then we know that 200 + 400 = 600. We also used our rounding and compensating method to add 99 as we realised it is easier to add 100 and then take away 1!

Year 4

This week in Year 4, we have been learning about rounding and compensating in maths using number lines. We have also been practising our times tables every day as our afternoon task.

In writing, we have been learning about when to use paragraphs and cause and effect conjunctions.

In reading, we have been feature spotting alliteration, power of three and persuasive sentence starters in letters to prepare us for our next big write.

The children have been enjoying learning about road safety this week too!

Year 6

This week, Year 6 have shown great resilience in maths. They have been classifying 2D shapes based on their properties and have then gone onto construct 2D shapes using protractors and compasses. They have worked hard to make connections between aspects of their prior learning. In Geography, we have been learning about trade and the children have explored the profit some companies make on the items they trade. They populated this into a graph and a table to make comparisons. In Science, we have enjoyed making our own working kaleidoscopes by applying our knowledge of reflection of light. To support in the consolidation of their learning, Year 6 have come home with their new homework books this week. They have been set a reading activity to complete. We look forward to seeing how they get on.

Year 5

This week Year 5 have enjoyed practically investigating reversible and irreversible changes in science. They have completed two investigations: 1) What substance is produced when you mix vinegar and milk 2) Creating a gas to inflate balloons when mixing a liquid -vinegar and a solid - bicarbonate of soda.

In Geography we have continued our topic of sustainability by looking at how the German city of Freiburg became a sustainable city with a carbon neutral football stadium. In Mathematics the students are multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 including decimals. In English our focus is still the book Wonder, our writing task will be to write a persuasive letter.
