

Grange Junior School Round Up Term 3 – Issue 4 – 2023 Termly Value – Aspiration

Year 3

In Maths we have continued our work on column addition where regrouping is required in multiple columns. We have also revisited the different adding strategies rounding and adjusting and partitioning and recombining.

In our tag rugby PE lesson, we have practiced passing the ball backwards whilst travelling and continued to work on our dodging skills.

In English, we have started to learn about apostrophes for possession and adverbs for frequency. We have combined these features to write sentences to describe a dragon. Year 4

This week, we have been looking at how to use apostrophes for possession in writing. We have been looking at singular and plural possessions. The children have loved using these in their diary entries.

In maths, we have continued to work on column addition and how to exchange within the columns. We have also revisited how to line them up correctly.

Year 6

In science, this week, Year 6 have been exploring the use of a data logger to collect measurements about the brightness of a bulb. We discussed how it is important to take repeated measurements to check the accuracy of your results and ensure you have a fair test. In computing, we have thoroughly enjoyed building games using Scratch. We have discussed how variables work and built algorithms which factor in these variables. The children particularly enjoyed building their own ping pong games. Our history topic this term is Ancient Greece. As part of this unit of work, we have been analysing sources including Greek pottery and written accounts of 'The Battle of Marathon.'

Year 5

This week, Year 5 have enjoyed looking at colour theory within our art unit of work. We created our own colour wheel and looked at warm and cool colours, focusing on how they can add to the atmosphere and mood of our artworks. In addition, we looked at complementary colours – those colours across from one another on the colour wheel – as these will be an important feature of our own surrealist landscape creations in the next few weeks.

In science, we looked at understanding why we have night and day. We used a torch and a ball to show how the rotation of the Earth causes this.

We've chosen Arbor to help us manage our school.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Arbor App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Arbor App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

How to get started

- 1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready you won't be able to log in before
- 2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
- 3. Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- 4. Click 'Install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
- 5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- 6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday


Need help using Arbor?

Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App or Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, e.g. an iPhone SE, and include screenshots or screen recordings.

To safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

Some tips to try:

- Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor. Ask us to check the email address linked to your account.
- 2. Reset your password from the login page, or ask us to do this.
- If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the password link will have expired. Ask us to send it again.
- Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice - e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
- 5. Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in.
- Only relatives who are Primary Guardians of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.
