

Year 3

This week in maths we have learnt how to subtract by 3-digit and 2-digit numbers when exchanging is required in the tens and hundreds. We have also been practising our times tables and number bonds within 10. In writing and reading we have continued to learn about non-chronological reports and their features in preparation for next week when we will write our own non-chronological report about dragons. In art we have sketched and painted landscapes using the pointillism painting technique, based on the famous artists that we have learnt about this term. We have continued to learn how to count up to 10 in French and have persevered in learning how to juggle using two beanbags for PHSE, understanding about setting yourselves goals and what steps you need to take to achieve them.

Year 4

This week, we have been looking at subordinate clauses in writing and remembering that we always need a comma to separate it from the main clause when the subordinate clause is first. In maths, we have continued looking at subtraction with exchanging in various columns. We have used our place value counters to help us.

In science, we have been talking about food chains and the roles of consumers, producers and predators. In art, we have been sketching landscapes in the style of Kandinsky.

Year 6

Year 6 have shown great artistic flair this week. They have sketched their landscape pictures in the style of the artist, David Hockney. It was great to see how they could use different types of landscape compositions to generate their own artwork. We look forward to painting them next week and seeing their final outcomes. In PE, the children enjoyed developing their ball control skills. They used different parts of their bodies to stop the ball. It was great to see their control develop. In maths, we have begun multiplying fractions. The children showed how they were able to apply their ability to simplify fractions to ensure their answers were in the simplest form.

Year 5

This week, in maths, Year 5 have finished our multiplication and division unit. This term, we have looked at the written method of long multiplication - new learning for us - and recapped short division which included answers with remainders. We all persevered with both of these methods and will continue to practice them so that we are confident! We have also started planning our final surrealist landscape artworks. We sketched out a few designs and then chose one of them to paint next week. We have all showed our creativity, thinking about how to mix real-life with unusual features...

We've chosen Arbor to help us manage our school.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Arbor App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Arbor App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

How to get started

- 1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready you won't be able to log in before
- 2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
- 3. Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- 4. Click 'Install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
- 5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- 6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday


Need help using Arbor?


Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App or Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, e.g. an iPhone SE, and include screenshots or screen recordings.

To safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

Some tips to try:

- Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor.
 Ask us to check the email address linked to your account.
- 2. Reset your password from the login page, or ask us to do this.
- If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the password link will have expired. Ask us to send it again.
- Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice - e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
- 5. Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in.
- Only relatives who are Primary Guardians of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.
