

Year 3

This week, year 3 have started looking at branching databases in computing. We have looked at how we can sort objects into yes or no categories.

In writing we have revisited how to punctuate direct speech making sure that we start a new line for a new speaker. We have written a conversation between the three little wolves and the big bad pig.

In maths, we now focusing on our times tables looking at the law of distribution which uses our partitioning skills from last term.

In science, we started our new topic of light and have identified different sources of light. We found out the moon is not a source of light.

Year 6

This week, Year 6 have worked incredibly hard in maths. We have been looking at methods to find a percentage of a number. It has been great to see them applying their skills of multiplication and division methods to assist them. In English, we have begun reading the book 'How to live forever' by Colin Thompson. We are so pleased to see the year group so enthused by a book. The inferences they have been making and the questions they have been asking have been exceptional. We can't wait to see how it inspires their writing. In PE, we have begun our unit of work on Quicksticks. Mr Harper was pleased to see the children's ball control skills and their ability to use space when passing.

Year 4

This week, year 4 have started looking the 'Barnabus Project' in writing. We have enjoyed creating our own imperfect pets and exploring themes and messages within the book. It has been lovely to see how enthusiastic they are about the book.

In maths, we have started looking at different written methods to calculate multiplication questions.

In science, we are now looking at the topic 'living things and their habitats.' We have explored how they can be grouped in different ways and made our own Venn diagrams to show this.

Year 5

Year 5 have had a great start to the new term in their enthusiasm to embrace our new topics, especially in English. We have created a cooperative art piece based on our new book, *Boy 87*, and have been exploring how the author uses figurative language to portray the main character and scenes. It has been wonderful to see how engaged the children are with this book.

In Maths, we have been looking at equivalent fractions and comparing fractions. The children have successfully applied their year 4 knowledge to this new topic and persevered in their work.
