

Year 3

This week, we have been learning about prepositions for cause and adverbs of time in preparation for writing our instructions next week.

In maths we have been looking at subtracting pounds and pence from £5 and £10. We have done this by either using our column subtraction skills or the counting up method on a number line.

In geography, we looked at the different National Parks in the UK and located them on a map using an atlas. We also looked at what physical and human features they have.

In PE, we have continued developing our handball skills and have applied these to a game situation.

Year 4

This week, we have been super proud of year 4. We have worked really hard to put on a fabulous performance for the Spring is Sprung assembly and shown some amazing singing.

In maths, we have continued working the topic on shapes and spotting different angles within them. We have also looked at prepositions for cause in writing so that we can use them in our phase 3 write.

Year 6

This week, Year 6 have been planning and writing some brilliant setting descriptions. The children have made real effort to make sure that their setting descriptions don't become narratives. The children have incorporated skills like: expanded noun phrases, personification and similes. The children have really built atmosphere into their writes and should be very proud themselves. The Year 6 teaching team would like to thank all Year 6 parents and children for engaging in meaningful and productive discussions during parents evening. It is great to see the children double down on their preparations for SATS.

Year 5

This week in Year 5 we have been writing about how to survive in the Danakil Desert. Different adverbial clauses have been used with embedded relative clauses also included. Our long write we are beginning is a survival guide on how to escape a desert prison. In Maths, we have been converting mixed units to calculate the perimeters of rectilinear shapes and discovering missing lengths of the shapes. In Science, our investigation was on water resistance. In Geography, our area study was on the different foods that are named after specific areas eg Cornish Pasties and why the food was first made there.

FINAL CELEBRATION ASSEMBLY


We will have our final celebration assembly of the term on Wednesday 27th March, during which we will also be announcing the winners of the FOGs Easter Egg colouring competition.


