

### Year 3

Year 6 have had a fantastic week in preparation for their SATS next week. In our Writing lessons, we have been writing instructions on how to capture a naughty child. The Y6 team are delighted with their work.

In Science, the children have been looking at the Linnaean classification of animals including humans. Their group use of IPADS to search for the relevant information was brilliant and really showcased their team working skills. Next week is SATS week.

### Year 5

In year 5 this week, we have been very fortunate to have a visit from two specialist Science teachers who came to talk to us about the work of Isaac Newton, telescopes and lenses. The children were fascinated when they observed the demonstration on dissecting an eye and witnessing how eye's lens works. We successfully used this knowledge to create our own telescopes using convex and concave lenses.

In Writing, we have enhanced our knowledge of model verbs and adverbials of possibility and used this skill to write an advert for the inn from *The Highwayman*. In Computing, we have been improving our understanding of Vector drawings, showing a range of skills in producing digital images.
