

Year 3

This week in year 3, we have enjoyed all the sporting activities that we have taken part in during sports week. In Art, we have explored the wonders of nature and how we can incorporate nature into our artwork.

In Maths, we have been learning about capacity and how we measure the amount of liquid in litres and millilitres. We also practiced our comparing, adding and subtracting skills.

In Science, we found out all about the famous Scientist Charles Darwin and how he studied animals. Next week, we get to become a scientist just like him to study birds in the school grounds.

Year 4

This week in Year 4, the children have been learning equivalent measures for litres, millilitres, kilograms and grams. In English we have been writing our Antarctic adventure stories, inspired by Shackleton's Journey, with some clever openings and exciting endings. During Sports Week and Arts Week, Year 4 have done a huge variety of activities, including Inter-House Rounders and skipping. Despite finding it difficult to create a woven art using a loom, inspired by nature, the children have shown great resilience and the results have been great. In Computing, the children have continued their unit of work on coding using Scratch learning infinite and repeated loop coding blocks. Keep practicing this at home!

Year 6

Year 6 have had such a busy but exciting week! For Art week, we have investigated using nature within our artwork. We looked closely at leaves and grasses to complete observational drawings as well this we looked at real-life chalk art (focusing on an American 'sidewalk' artist called David Zinn) and created whimsical artworks using real-life elements like weeds!

For Sports week, we loved working with another class in a different year group to share our sports knowledge. We also enjoyed our session with 'Dan the Skipping Man' where we learned basic skipping techniques and then moved onto learning challenging tricks!

Year 5

This week, year five have loved taking part in a range of sports activities which have helped them to work on their resilience and teamwork skills.

They have also loved art this week where they have been looking at how nature can be incorporated into their art pieces. They have produced some lovely artwork by using leaves, sticks and flowers to decorate a portrait.

Year five have also produced some brilliant work for their phase three write where they have written a prequal to the music video 'Titanium'.
