### Year 3

This week in year 3, we have been writing our eyewitness reports from the view point of a farmer from the story 'The Iron Man.' We have been working hard to make sure we are including adverbs of time, subordinating conjunctions and the past progressive tense.

In geography, we have looked at the different ways our rivers can be polluted and designed a poster to advise people on the dangers and how to keep them clean. In PSHE, we have looked at the words 'stereotyping' and 'prejudice' and designed a set of bedcovers so that it could be suitable for both girls and boys. In French, we have continued learning the different names of animals and have been improving our pronunciation.

### Year 6

This week in year 6 we have been practicing our year 6 production. This week we have been focusing on Stage presence and how to make a scene more effective with the use of props.

In maths the children have been looking at area of parallelograms and triangles, they have been using all of the skills taught this year around 2d shapes to successfully solve these questions. They have also been learning about earthquakes and their links to the changes on our planet, they were very enthusiastic and asked many questions.

### Year 4

This week in year 4, we have been adding to our vocabulary in French. We can now order ice creams in full sentences and ask for it in a bowl or a cone.

In science, we all did an experiment to test the best material for keeping water warm for the longest. We tested a variety of materials and recorded our information in a scientific table.

In writing, we have continued recapping the different skills. We have looked at what features are in a diary entry and had a go at putting subordinate clauses at the end of our sentences.

In PE, we had a great rounders tournament on Thursday where the children are really developing their skills.

### Year 5

This week in Year 5 we have been planning our writing. We have collected all the gold-coloured items we could think of and made them into expanded noun phrases. We have also collected verbs to help us with our instruction pamphlet.

In Mathematics we have completed an arithmetic paper, interpreted information from graphs.

In Computing, we were designing the flow of a program that contains 'if... then... else...' using Scratch. If the answer is correct, then the programme does this, or else the programme does that if the answer is incorrect!


# YEAR 6 PRODUCTION – WHOLE SCHOOL PERFORMANCE & TICKET REQUESTS
