Year 3 have had an amazing start back to the term. So many children have already got lots of reads in their reading record for our race! Well done! In science, we have started our new unit of forces and magnets. We have been discussing different pushes and pulls. In maths, we have been looking at finding unit fractions of amounts. In writing, we are looking at prepositions and subordinate clauses. We designed our own aliens based on our new book — 'Lights on Cotton Rock'. We had an interesting discussion this week in PSHE about stereotyping and gender roles with responsibilities around the house. All the children were very grown up in their answers! Keep it up Year 3!

Year 4

Summer term is here and with it some fantastic learning opportunities. This week we have been learning about healthy eating and have planned our own healthy sandwiches which they will assemble next week. The children have started digging into what decimals are and the different ways they are represented. We have a new book for our Writing and Reading lessons, Harry Potter! The children are excited to learn more about the wonders of Hogwarts and a mysterious character who we shall not name. In Science we are learning about sound. The children have shown fantastic prior knowledge and enjoyed investigating vibrations using rice drums in our first lesson.

Year 6

This week, Year 6 has focused on their maths revision. We found it really useful to work in small groups to complete a reasoning paper. We discussed strategies between ourselves to help each other spot patterns and use prior knowledge to solve a range of problems. Within classes, we have discussed areas we wish to recap. This includes finding percentages of amounts, dividing fractions by a whole number and subtracting decimals.

Year 5

Welcome back everyone.

This week, in Year 5, we have started our new unit: calculating with fractions. We have been challenged to solve the tasks using our knowledge of equivalent fractions to be able to add fractions with different denominators. In English, we started our writing unit with The Highwayman poem by Alfred Noyes. We very much enjoyed exploring different characters through drama activities; this was very helpful to write a diary entry and a letter as Tim, the ostler showing (not telling) his emotions. In Science, we explored levers as simple machines. We are looking forward to next week to continue with our learning.

FOGS MAY FAYRE RAFFLE


