

### Year 3

### Welcome back year 3!

This week in year 3, the children have shown resilience by taking a few assessments in a variety of subjects. They have learned about different ice cream flavours in French. In writing, children have revisited inverted commas and also apostrophes to show possession. We practised this by labelling up our main character "Iron Man" from our book. In maths, children have been converting from mm to cm and comparing and ordering amounts using M, mm and cm. In RE, children have been discussing commitments they have both inside and outside of school.

### Year 6

The highlight of this week for Year 6 was undoubtedly our trip to Junior Good Citizen! We had the opportunity to work in teams and take part in various challenges that allowed us to put what we know about keeping ourselves safe into practice. We learned lots of new things about staying safe on rail lines, roads, online and in our everyday lives. It was also eye-opening to see that, even if we have the knowledge, putting it into practice in the moment can be tricky! Our teachers were super impressed with our knowledge and behaviour on the day; special congratulations go to the Cheese Warriors, who scored the highest of all the Grange teams!

We also began rehearsals for Peter Pan – the Pirate Song was an immediate favourite!

### Year 4

We are very proud of the children in Year 4 this week. They have completed their statutory multiplication test check. They have demonstrated resilience, bravery and aspiration and really took it in their stride. In addition, this week, we have begun preparing for our sports day. The children have enjoyed the opportunity to begin their unit of athletics work. In art, we have continued building on our printing skills. The children are confidently making printing plates using a range of media, ready to make their own cityscape pieces. In English, we have begun sharing the book 'Shackleton's Journey by William Grill.' We are developing a firm understanding of how challenging it would be on an expedition across Antarctica.

### Year 5

We were ery excited to start our last term in Year 5. In Maths this week, we have finished our Geometry – Measurement unit (volume and capacity).

In English, we were very much surprised as our new writing unit is based on a music clip, Titanium by David Guetta. We were exploring characters' feelings and emotions as well as tweeting about them using showing, not telling technique. We also wrote a short-burst narrative to portray characters using this technique. In Art, we were sketching Swindon landmarks so that we can create our final Art print (three-colour layered reduction print) next week. We are looking forward to exhibiting our masterpieces!
