Welcome back year 4! Everyone has come back with a huge smile on their face and a ready to learn attitude!

In maths, we have been looking at place value all the way up to thousands. We have been writing numbers into words and vice versa. In writing, we have been looking at our visual literacy – Soar. All children have been rewriting the story in their own words and recapping year 3 skills. In science, children, children have been learning about the differences and properties of solids, liquids and gases.

We are looking forward to seeing how many reads we can all do this year!

### Year 5 Welcome back Year 5!

We have had a very busy first week back in Upper Key Stage Two! In Maths, we started looking at place value — up to ten thousands. We all enjoyed using manipulatives to represent 5-digit numbers. In Writing, we have written a short narrative based on the film clip, SOAR, from the little boy's point of view. In Science, we started our very first unit of the year: Living things and their habitats. We have studied the parts of the flower; we were thrilled when we found the anther, filament, stigma and other parts of flowering plants - dissecting a flower is good fun! In History, we tweeted our answers to the big question: Why do we study the Kingdom of Benin? Our teachers and assistants were very pleased with our learning attitude. We are looking forward to next week.
