This month our subject spotlight showcases modern foreign languages. We use an online website called Language Angels to teach basic conversational French throughout the school. Although not statutory in KS1, class 1 take part in fun activities and songs to give them an introduction into the importance of learning a different language and knowing about other cultures of the world. It has been a necessary part of the KS2 curriculum for the last ten years and allows children to learn basic language patterns, phonics and conversations for familiar scenarios of life, such as going to a café, the seasons of the year, fruits and vegetables, families and general greetings. All this gives a good grounding for taking on an additional language when older.
