# Subject Spot Light - Reading

This month the subject spotlight is Reading. Reading is so important at Grange Moor and is the key to opening up access to wider learning in all subjects for children. Reading is taught and developed through three key aspects:

**Skilled Word Reading –** We follow Little Wandle Phonics Scheme to ensure children learn the skills they need to read words and build fluency.

Good Comprehension – Alongside building skills for reading words, we also make sure children build skills to understand what they read and be able to comprehend pictures and texts.

A Love of Reading – Wrapped around the above two points is a culture where texts, books and stories are celebrated and enjoyed by children.

Regular reading, opportunities to choose and share books and conversations about what is being read make three points of a really important reading triangle. Thank you for all your support in facilitating and encouraging these points at home too 😳
