Subject Spotlight Mathematics

Two areas as a parent and a teacher I have always focused on is' telling the time' and learning times tables. These are vital for everyday life and makes the world a much easier place to be in.

Times tables are vital to success in Maths, these are the building blocks/ foundations and will help in all areas of Maths. Did you know that by the end of Year 4 the government expects all pupils to know their times tables and children have to take part in an online assessment.
