





them to explore the world with holiday planning in term 2. In addition, the group have also been introduced to a new area of learning, Life Skills. They have been learning how to complete different DIY activities in life skills lessons. They have painted a feature wall, built and upcycled furniture as well as visiting different homeware shops to gain an insight into things needed to make a house into a functioning home.
