Dear Parents/Carers,

The end of the half term looms, we break up at 3.30pm next Thursday. Before that we have our annual harvest festival to fit in. This is being led by Year 1 on Wednesday 18th October at 9am in our school hall. Parents and carers are more than welcome to join us, but the space will be limited.

In teaching our children about the harvest we try to explain the idea on different levels. At its very simplest it is about farmers and gardeners bringing in all the crops that have been nurtured throughout the year and how these then feed and sustain us. However, there is the global aspect to harvest and our food - those things called Food Miles! This is a way of attempting to measure how far food has travelled before it reaches the customers. It is a good way of looking at the environmental impact of foods. The average food item travels 1,837 miles before it is eaten in the UK. <u>https://www.foodmiles.com/</u> Lets you investigate different food items in your fridge or cupboard.

Another key aspect that we think about at harvest time is Fairtrade. This is a worldwide movement that helps farmers and producers earn a fair amount for the goods they grow or make. Find out more https://www.fairtrade.org.uk/media-centre/fairtrade-videos/

Finally, what will we do with your harvest gifts this year? We would ask if you could kindly donate tins, packets, long life milk, shampoos, soaps, washing powder etc . Fresh items are more difficult for us to sort out. Our food bank 'Take what you need, give when you can' is used to support a whole range of families. Some are regular users and others just dip in when things get tight. Whatever the reason it does not matter - we are a family there to support each other. Our uniform rail is also available. If you have any childrens winter coats, in reasonable condition, that could be passed on to someone else, please hand these in to the office.
