A long, long time ago, there was a man named Valentine. He lived in the city of Rome, which was ruled by a very strict Emperor named Claudius. Emperor Claudius wanted a giant army, but he had a problem: he thought that if men were married and had families they loved, they wouldn't want to go away to fight in wars. So, he made a very mean rule—no one was allowed to get married! Valentine was a kind priest who believed that love was the most important thing in the world. He knew how sad the couples were, so he decided to help them in secret. In the middle of the night, in beautiful hidden gardens, Valentine would perform secret weddings. He would whisper the vows and hand the couples paper hearts to remind them of their love and their promises to each other. Eventually, the Emperor found out. Valentine was sent to prison for breaking the rules. But even in a dark, cold prison, Valentine's heart stayed kind. He became friends with the jailer's daughter and helped her with her lessons. Before he left, he wrote her a note to say thank you for her friendship. He signed it: "From your Valentine."

He showed us that: Love is worth standing up for.


Parentpay Lunches















They had to think about the features of a castle - is their design stable and strong?




YEAR OF READING: LIVE SESSION & POETRY
