An important note from Mr Longley regarding Attendance

Dear Parents/Carers.

Attendance is a massive focus in school and it has become a larger area of focus for both Ofsted and the Department for Education and, as a result, the school is feeling more pressure to improve attendance.

Our school currently sits below the national and local average and so an improvement needs to be seen. If you wish to go on holiday, this must be done during the school holidays. Regardless of the cost, the loss of learning that takes place during any in term holidays is often too great to properly recover from.

If your child is experiencing a minor illness but is not restricted to bed rest, please still send them to school. We often find that children's spirits lift when they are engaged with their friends and classroom activities. We are happy to administer necessary medication (with appropriate documentation). Should your child become genuinely too unwell to remain, we will contact you immediately for collection. We will never force an unwell child to stay.

Please do what you can to support the school improve attendance and in turn, children's education.

Year 4 welcomed their parents into their Roman museum. They completed a quiz using the knowledge they had learned.




Year 2 with their completed Freddie's Challenge sheets
