



We have kept the increase of prices off for as long as possible and it has now become unfeasible for us to continue at this current cost. The school will continue to subsidise part of the cost, but this extra money from parents will allow the school to spend this money on other areas of the school.

This will not affect any students who are entitled to Free School Meals, as the school receives special funding for these dinners.

We hope this increase in cost does not cause too many issues for anyone and we sincerely apologise for this increase.

From Sept 2024, the government have announced funding for a national wraparound childcare programme.

The funding is to enable schools and local providers to set up and expand before and after school childcare provision and can include private, voluntary and independent organisations, schools and childminders. The wraparound childcare can operate on a school site or at another setting in the area, term time only.
