We want to take a moment to discuss the importance of arriving at school on time. Our school day begins promptly at **8:45 am**, and those first few minutes are some of the most vital.


When a child arrives late, even by just five or ten minutes, it can have a significant impact:

- **Missed Learning:** The start of the day is when teachers explain the schedule and deliver key "warm-up" instructions for core subjects.
- **Social Anxiety:** Entering a classroom that is already quiet and working can be very daunting and embarrassing for a child.
- **Disruption:** It interrupts the flow of the lesson for the rest of the class and the teacher.
- **Habit Forming:** Punctuality is a life skill. Arriving on time helps children feel calm, prepared, and ready to succeed.

We understand that mornings can be hectic, but we appreciate your support in ensuring your child is through the gates before the third whistle blows. Don't put your child at a disadvantage - get them here on time. **Thank you for your continued support in making our school a vibrant place to learn!**




Silver Coins


