		Due to Covid restrictions continuing in school for the whole year, mixing bubbles for competitive sports events could not go ahead.				
		Equipment was provided for all classes, which was used only by their bubble, with cleaning managed effectively by the classroom staff. The continuation of high levels of staffing at lunchtime to allow for bubbles to be kept separate has allowed for staff to lead on games and activities at play and lunchtimes. Children have reported positively to this way of organising play times and this is something that will continue in the next academic year.				
		Work to make improvements to the outdoor area has not been undertaken. This will become a focus for the upcoming year.				
		Money to be carried over into 2021/22 academic year: £21,710 Due to the continuing Covid-19 pandemic, the restrictions in place and the challenges of overcoming barriers as a result, the school sports premium was largely unspent during this academic year.
