This may be because a Topic is assessed in a single question worth 8 or more marks (a high tariff question). It may also be because a Topic is assessed in a number of questions with lower tariffs (e.g one 4-mark question and two 2-mark questions).</p> <p>Topics that are not listed on the Advance Information, but are still assessed in a Paper, are therefore likely to feature in a small number of 1- or 2-mark questions, in a single 3- or 4-mark question, or via synoptic questions.</p>
