Headteacher Update

I hope you are well and looking forward to a relaxing Christmas break. School closes next week on Wednesday 20th December at 12.10pm. The school buses will be leaving shortly afterwards. If your child requires a lunch before they leave, please email their Year team so we can arrange that.

Just like last year, on Wednesday, students and staff will be able to wear their Christmas Jumper to school if they want to. If anyone would like to make a voluntary donation they can and we will donate any money raised to St Rocco's Hospice. If students prefer not to wear a Christmas jumper then that is fine. The jumper will be the only non-uniform item allowed on the day.

As is often the case at the end of term, we are saying farewell to a few colleagues. I would like to thank them all for their hard work and dedication. Mrs Wright, Music Services Manager and Peri Teacher, is leaving us after 36 years of great service. I wish her a very long, happy retirement. Mr English (Maths), Mrs Neill (English), Mr Roberts (Business) & Miss Cheung (EAL Support) are also leaving at the end of term along with Mr Wright who has been covering a maternity leave in Maths. On behalf of the students, Governors, parents, carers, and staff I would like to thank them all the very best of luck for the future.

It has been a long but productive term. Year 11, 8 & 9 have completed their first set of assessments recently. Miss Delmont commented that the Year 11 Mocks may have been the best set of mocks she has experienced

since being Exams Officer at Great Sankey. I think this is down to the way the students dealt with the process so maturely and seriously. For other year groups, we have changed the way assessments are carried out. This was very much thanks to feedback from parents. The assessment dates are on the school website. Revision lists and assessment timetables are shared with students and parent/carers a few weeks ahead. This has improved the process and reduced the stress of not knowing when certain tests were. We have also reduced the number of assessment rounds from 3 to 2 to help with staff workload as well as the mental health of our youngsters.

In January, we will open the first floor of our dining facility which will provide a more pleasant environment as well as 10 additional toilets. Students tell me the extra time they have at break now has made a big difference to them and the dining facility is now, across 2 floors, able to accommodate all students on break or lunch. This will open on Monday 8th January.

I look back on the whole year at Great Sankey with some pride. There have been some real highlights. The sporting achievements of many teams, the outstanding Addams Family production, the Dance show, the trips to areas around Europe and the UK, a new Junior Leadership Team, a successful Ofsted inspection, a newly restructured pastoral system with more capacity to work with students on progress, mental health and other needs and the return of face to face events for parents. We do not rest on our laurels however and I know there is still much to do. For now, I wish you all a merry Christmas and a very happy New Year.

Each student has been given the exciting opportunity to choose a free book from a diverse selection of 16 titles. Quality Assurance and Literary Exploration:

Year 7 and Year 8 have read a combined total of 44, 827, 785 words so far this year! This is significantly higher than previous years. Year 7 have read a total of 20,450, 509 words and Year 8 have read a total of 24,377,276 (They are currently on track to beat their word count from last year!)

Debate Club

Does your child have a lot to say about lots of different topics? If so, they may enjoy our new Debate Club. Some of the best and brightest Year 9 students have joined Mr. Riley's debate club this term, where they are learning some really valuable life skills. We discuss some important issues such as freedom of speech, and hopefully will be looking to enter competitions later this year. We also get to play some fun debating games to get everyone's brains going - games like 'rebuttal tennis' and 'How would you spend a million pounds?' In Debate Club students are learning how to research, put together and critique an argument, how to project themselves with confidence and we have fun doing it! I will be looking to open debate club to Year 8 students in the New Year, so if your child is interested, please tell them to come and see Mr. Riley in HM4.



School Uniform—A Reminder

As we reach the end of term, we would like to take the opportunity to revisit the uniform expectations so that students are prepared for the return after Christmas. Uniform is an important part of a school's identity. It reinforces who we are as a community and helps allow students to feel pride in their school. It also helps prepare students for life after school where many will have to dress smartly for work. The uniform policy is available on the website for further reference, but please see the additional guidance below:

Socks - black ankle socks.

Shoes – black polishable leather or simulated leather. No boots, canvas shoes or trainer style shoes are permitted, including branded sports makes including (but not limited to) Nike, Adidas, Reebok, Converse, Stan Smiths and Vans. We are aware that companies do market these as school shoes but they must meet our criteria.

Make-up, false eyelashes, nail varnish or jewellery – must not be worn for school. Items of jewellery which are not in line with the policy will be confiscated and students can collect at the end of the day from their year office for first offences.

If you have any questions about the guidance, please do not hesitate to contact your child's year team or refer to the uniform policy on the website. If you are unsure whether a piece of uniform is acceptable, please consult the school before buying. Attendance to School

To report a student absence please use the Bromcom My Child At School App using the message facility. If you do not have the app, please telephone reception. Students should arrive at school with enough time to get to their Form Room by 8.20am. If your child is going to be late for a specific reason, please contact us via the app or by phone.

Every half day absence has to be classified by the school (not by parent/carers) as either authorised or unauthorised. Information about the cause of any absence is always required, preferably in writing.

Authorised absences are mornings or afternoons away from school for a good reason such as illness or medical / dental appointments which **unavoidably** fall in school time, or emergencies.

Unauthorised absences are those which the school does not consider reasonable. This includes:

- Parents/carers keeping pupils off unnecessarily.
- Truancy before or during the school day.
- Absences which have never been properly explained.
- Shopping, looking after other children or birthdays.
- Day trips and holidays in term time.
- Oversleeping.
- Absence to look after a sibling who is unwell.
