<p><b>Paper 1 Content:</b></p> <p>The first section of Paper 1 will be Conflict and Tension and cover the full course. As a result of your revision you should be able to answer the following enquiry questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Was the Treaty of Versailles fair?</li> <li>● Why did the League of Nations fail?</li> <li>● Why did the Second World War begin?</li> </ul>	<p><b><u>Paper 2 Content</u></b></p> <p>The second section will focus on USA opportunity and inequality. As we are currently teaching this course the content of the exam will be from everything up to and including the 1932 election</p>
