- There is no requirement for you to answer the questions in order.
- You need to manage your time effectively:
 - Do not obsess about the multiple-choice questions. Spend no longer than 8 minutes on this section (5 MCQ's), preferably less. You may want to leave this section until last (leaving maximum 8 minutes) in order to make sure you don't spend too much time on this section
 - You can choose to answer the 30-mark questions first to ensure you have enough time to do them justice. You should leave 35 minutes each for these questions.
 - Question 9 – make sure the majority of your time (at least 10 minutes) is spent on addressing the first part (concept or theory) of the question. No more than 5 minutes to be spent on the second part.
 - Question 11 – again, make sure most of your time (25 mins) is spent on the first part of your answer. No more than 10 minutes should be spent on the second part evaluation.
