

The Psychology Mock will reflect a **paper 2 exam** as much as possible. Instead of **“criminal psychology”** which you have not studied yet, you will be tested on **Social Influence** which is from **paper 1** .

- **Research Methods (Paper 2)** – 25 marks and 1 x 12 mark SERVES (37 marks)
- **Sleep and dreaming (paper 2)** 12 marks and 1 x 9 marker (21 marks)
- **Social Influence (Paper 1)** – 12 marks and 1 x 9 marker. This is going to be the *issues and debates question* from paper 1 (21 marks)

Total marks – 79 marks.
