Where are we at?

- Visits to 75% of primary schools completed.
- SEND register for new induction day is in process.
- Organising an additional SEND transition day for students who are on the register and those who primary recommend.
- Pupil passports (strategies for staff to support pupils and remove barriers) have started to be completed
- Additional visits for students when advised by primary.
- Enhanced visits from Mrs French for individual students.
- Authorisation for an SEND summer school for three days in the summer to support reintegration.
- Planned SEND transition day in July, in advance of the two day transition day for all students

How do we ensure this from September

- Audit of the SEND register which will be shared with staff.
- Identified students to be put on one of three codes E (EHCP), K (SEND support), W (watch list).
- Completion of pupil passports- these will be sent out to parents by the end of week three and any amendments can be made following this.
- Anyone on the SEND register will be allocated a link TA who will meet with them a minimum of once every two weeks for the first half term and twice every other half term.
- Screening CATS tests and NGRT- data shared with all staff so that quality first teaching can be put in place in addition to further interventions both at departmental level and SEND level.



How do we ensure this from September

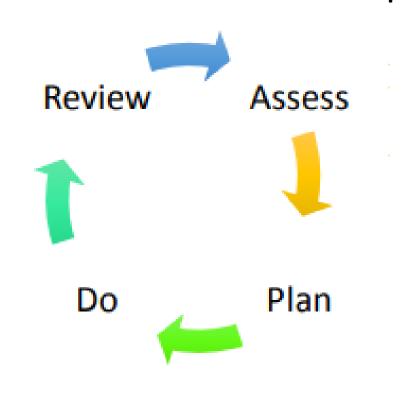
- All Year 7 students on the SEND register can access a dedicated homework club which is manned by TAs and bespoke support is provided available as needed so that school and home can remain separate.
- Minimum weekly meetings with members of the year team to identify any concerns flagged by teachers, support staff, parents or pupils.
- In addition to tutor evening, parents evening and annual reviews each student on the SEND register will be invited to an additional meeting after Christmas to review progress.
- Staff have access to training from the ADHD foundation and SEND training takes place as part of briefing.

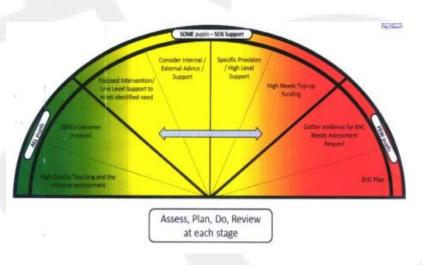

Diagnosis? EHCP?



- Analysis of CATS/ SATS/NGRT data.
- Base line data and in school assessments
- Staff referrals.
- Information gathering –out of lessons, attendance.

Next

- Quality First Teaching.
- Interventions- do they rectify the concerns and remove the barriers?
- Therapeutic counselling.
- Short term bespoke timetables.
- TA support.



Frequently worries- and reassuring responses

The school is so big.

Yes it is but there are lots of positives.

- Walking between lessons meets movement needs for a lot of students with ADHD.
- Walking between lessons meets the sensory needs for a lot of students with ASC.
- The time in between lessons acts as a time to regulate your emotions.
 - Research proves the regular movement breaks aid learning.



Frequently worries- and reassuring responses

My child has too many teachers

- It is a big jump.
- Lots of primary schools prep students for this.
- A variety of teachers benefits students who thrive off challenge.



Frequently worries- and reassuring responses

There are too many books to carry

- Teachers mostly hold the books for students after each lesson.
- Carrying books around school helps to meet sensory needs.
- We can provide trays for students if needed.
 - ALWAYS pack your bag the night before.
