Get organised!

- Put the assessment dates in your calendar on your phone.
- Make a realistic revision timetable:
 - About 30 minutes per day
 - Specific activities to learn specific things e.g. flash cards to remember definitions of key words about Power in History.
- Have your books, knowledge organisers and other revision resources ready.

Be active!

Making your notes look pretty is a nice thing to do, but that alone won't help you learn. You need to do something active with the information you're trying to remember.

The best active revision techniques:

- Test yourself it takes effort to remember something, and this helps to strengthen your memory. Test with your friends. Give your notes to someone at home and get them to test you!

- Help yourself: Make a dedicated revision space, studying in tidy surroundings will help you concentrate. If you can't do this at home, you can use the library after school every day of the week.
- Challenge yourself: people spend too much time revising what they know because it feels comfortable. Concentrate on the topics you struggle with first, it's harder, but worth it.
- **Reward yourself:** do something you really enjoy after revising. This will help motivate you to get it done!
