Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back and Happy New Year! All students in year 7 and 8 have been given their knowledge organisers for the spring term ahead; these should be available in school each day to support students in class but also used at home as a homework and assessment preparation resource.

To support students in developing effective revision and learning habits, we have created a knowledge organiser homework plan (see overleaf). Week A homework will consist of learning key sections of the knowledge organiser using the read, cover, write, check, correct technique. Guidance on how to do this effectively can be found on page 3 of the knowledge organiser and will be re-iterated with students during assembly and form time. On Week B, teaching staff will set a wide range of appropriate homework activities — these should be recorded in your child's planner and on the sims app. If you have difficulty accessing the sims app please contact enquiries@greatsankey.org.

The curriculum students study in key Stage 3 has been designed to be engaging and to lay the foundations for successful progression to Key Stage 4 and beyond. The knowledge and skills acquired by students during Key Stage 3 are essential for future success. Towards the end of each term, all student in year 7 and 8 complete the same assessments as their peers. Crucially, these assess all of the knowledge and skills taught to students up to that point. Content within the knowledge organisers forms the basis of these assessments. For example, approximately 80% of the assessment this term will be based on the current spring term and the remaining 20% will be based on the autumn term. Therefore, it is essential students retain their knowledge organisers from each term to support their revision. Spring term assessments for year 7 and 8 will take place between the 9th and 20th March, during normal lessons.



























Furthermore, to encourage reading for pleasure, expand vocabulary and improve students' reading and writing skills we have introduced 'Drop Everything and Read' (DEAR). This is dedicated time where, no matter where you are or what you are doing, students and staff spend time reading for pleasure. All Year 7 and 8 pupils will be taking part in DEAR one lesson per week – there will be a rolling timetable to avoid pupils missing the same subjects. Consequently, students will be expected to have their Accelerated Reader reading book with them at all times in school. There is a DEAR reflection log incorporated into the knowledge organisers to support this initiative.

Finally, as part of our drive to expand vocabulary and improve reading skills, the knowledge organisers also contain tier 2 and 3 vocabulary lists. These are key terms that students are expected to define and use within their speaking and writing to be successful at school and beyond. Tier 2 are generic terms used across the curriculum and tier 3 is subject specific vocabulary. We would encourage you to support your child in learning these at home.
